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### GOVERNOR'S WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT DIRECTIVE NO. PY2000-05, Change 35


**SUBJECT:** The Forms Preparation Handbook revised page A-1.

- 1. Purpose.** This directive transmits the revised page Appendix A (A-1) of the Forms Preparation Handbook, which contains the income chart to be used in determining whether individuals meet the low income criteria of Title I of the Workforce Investment Act (WIA).
- 2. Discussion.** Under Title I of the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 (Public Law 105-220), the Secretary of Labor annually determines the Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) for uses described in the Law. WIA defines the term "Low Income Individual" as one who qualifies under various criteria, including an individual who received income for a six-month period that does not exceed the higher of the poverty line or 70 percent of the lower living standard income level. This issuance (Federal Register / Vol. 75, No. 88, May 7, 2010) provides the Secretary's annual Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) for 2010 and references the current 2009 Health and Human Services "Poverty Guidelines" (Federal Register / Vol. 74, No. 14, January 23, 2009). **This income chart is to be used to determine low-income only. It is not to be confused with the issuance of the self-sufficiency income chart.**
- 3. Action.** Please replace the previously transmitted page Appendix A (A-1) in the *Forms Preparation and Data Validation Requirements Handbook* with the revised Page A-1 attached to this directive. Subrecipients and staff should ensure that their respective eligibility certification staff uses the revised income chart in determining whether individuals meet the low income criteria.

**These guidelines go into effect on the day they were published, May 7, 2010.** Any participant evaluated based on the prior Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) amounts on or after May 7, 2010, whose level of service was affected, may be re-evaluated.
